



Exposure Control Plan - Important Components

- ☑ Document is accessible to employees.
- ☑ Reviewed on an annual basis. Date of review added to document for reviewers/auditors.
- ☑ Updated as needed to reflect new or modified tasks and procedures which affect occupational exposure and to reflect new or revised employee positions with occupational exposure.
- ☑ Exposure determination should contain a list of all job duties (classifications) that could result in occupational exposure, including the Principal Investigator.
- ☑ States the use of universal precautions to prevent contact with blood or other potentially infectious material.
- ☑ As applicable: Laundry (both employee and patient/participant)
 - If potentially contaminated:
 - > Will be handled as little as possible
 - > Bagged or packaged at the origination location in order to contain any potential leaks or spillage
 - > Handled only with appropriate PPE
- ☑ All regulated waste shall either be incinerated or decontaminated by a method such as autoclaving known to effectively inactivate bloodborne pathogens.
- ☑ Procedures for immediate reporting of a spill or accident that results in exposure incident.
- ☑ The employer must offer the hepatitis B vaccine series to all employees, free of charge, whose duties may result in an occupational exposure. The employee may decline the series via a declination form.
- ☑ The employer must offer post-exposure evaluation and follow-up, free of charge, to all employees who have had an exposure incident.
- ☑ Training will be provided upon hire and at least annually.
- ☑ Detail safe sharps procedures and practices and have it reviewed via a committee that includes representatives from various levels.
